Grand Prize winner at the International OMNIMAX® Film Festival, "Chronos" passes through many must-see geographical and architectural settings from New York and Paris to the Grand Canyon, Monument Valley and Segovia Castle as it casts its spell on viewers young and old. The film was originally shot in the IMAX 70 mm format and was released theatrically in IMAX® Theaters. A presentation of the Reuben H. Fleet Space Theater and S.E.M. La

R&B will release the pair of HD titles in January of 2006 through their strategic partners, Goldhil Entertainment. In addition, R&B will be making copies available to consumer electronics equipment manufacturers to promote the latest in new platform high definition DVD players. "I'm a great believer in letting the consumers decide what they want," says R&B president Rich Casey. "I see no reason why anyone should be prohibited from enjoying great films due to their High Definition format."

Casey has long been a champion of new technology and advocates advancing the state-of-the-art in entertainment product whenever possible. "We've spared no effort in making our DVDs the highest quality, most technologically advanced home entertainment products on the market," says Casey. His commitment to higher quality has made him an industry leader with the Ultimate DVD Collection Series of demonstration discs, the first 96/24 DTS Surround title (the standard DVD release of "Chronos") and the first home theater set-up and calibration disc produced in multiple languages.
